### '1950'

Korean War National Museum Chairman Denis Healy, announced exciting the news recently. Hollywood movie director, Rob Cohen, will be directing "1950". "1950" will be a major movie on the Korean War. The budget has been set at \$100 million, making it the biggest budgeted film in the history of the Korean film industry. CJ E&M, Korea's leading production and distributor in Asia and Grapevine Entertainment are producing the film.

Cohen said of the project, "The Korean War has often been referred to as the 'forgotten war' and I think it's time it was remembered. Telling the story of this harrowing conflict through the eyes of pioneering journalist Marguerite Higgins makes it a very different war film on every level."

Marguerite Higgins, a Pulitzer Prize winning war correspondent for the New York Herald Tribune, covered some of the Korean War's most important historical events. "Her journey across the Korean peninsula with an American platoon, which culminated in the bulk evacuation of nearly 200,000 South Koreans from the advancing armies of the Chinese and North Koreans on Christmas Eve, is set to form the backbone of the film." Last year, Marguerite Higgins was posthumously awarded the Heunnginjang, one of South Korea's most prestigious national medals.

Casting will be with Hollywood A-listers and Asian stars. Production is expected to begin next May, with a planned international release date of Spring 2013, coinciding with the 60th Anniversary of the Korean War Armistice Agreement.

### HOUSTON'S NATIONAL CEMETERY DIRECTOR

The Houston National Cemetery Director has been surrounded with controversy for months now. The director, Arleen Ocasio, has made a lot of changes since she took the helm several years ago. Among the changes are banning the words "God", "God Bless You", and even intervening to stop families burying their loved ones, from having the full VFW ritual, which includes a prayer and references to God, by the VFW Honor Guard.

A group, the Liberty Institute, has filed a lawsuit to have her removed from her post. The Liberty Institute represents the VFW District 4, the American Legion Post 586, The National Memorial Ladies, three families and Pastor Scott Rainey.

## **HOUSE BILL 1514**

Effective Sept. 1, 2011, thanks to Rep. Jason Isaac and Sen. Brian Birdwell, Texas Veterans can now request the word **VETERAN** be put on their Texas drivers license. This bill allows any person who served in the U.S. Military, as well as members of the Texas National Guard, to make this request. The veteran must show proof of their service and honorable discharge to obtain this designation.

This legislature came in response to veterans seeking an easier way to verify their military service to businesses, organizations and events that provide benefits and discounts to veterans.

The license designation is a convenient way to provide proof without having to produce a copy of your DD-214.
